### A bit of background

The SIU was established 15 months ago as a centralised function with ongoing responsibility for implementing and coordinating the government's social investment approach across the social sector.

Our goal is to advance and embed a social investment approach across the social sector, complementing investment activities already underway in a number of agencies. And we're doing this with data and analytics.

By social investment we mean taking a personcentric approach to service design and delivery – doing things now that will pay off in the future. It means making the right investments in people's education, health, and well-being so they can live more fulfilling and productive lives.

It also means investing in communities so they can enable people to thrive – or support them when things fall down.

# Some key achievements

Our work is moving at a fast pace. We'd like to invite you to check out some of our key achievements to date (there's more coming):

- <u>Data Exchange</u> the launch of 'Prod-1' the transfer of data between MSD and the Methodist Mission Southern – is expected next week.
- <u>Social Investment Analytical Layer</u> in Statistics NZ's <u>Integrated Data Infrastructure</u> (IDI) – was launched in September.
- <u>Social Investment Measurement Map</u> (SIMM) –
  provides information on what type of measures
  are available before authorised users access
  Statistics NZ's Integrated Data Infrastructure (IDI).
- <u>Budget 2017</u> we're working with agencies wanting to implement a social investment approach for Budget 2017.

 Fourth Data Hui – along with Statistics NZ and the Data Futures Partnership, we co-hosted the fourth Data Hui, in association with the Minister of Finance, on 22 November.
